PASTOR

“Eleven!”

“Precious in the sight of the LORD is the death of his saints.”

Psalm 116:15

Eleven! Eleven deaths of members of Christiana since All Saints’ Sunday last year:

Bill Meacham, Maxine Casper, Lane Pethel, Carolyn Corl, Ann Carscaddon, Katherine Lysterly, Patti Boles, Ann Renegar, Doris Pethel, Pauline Lysterly, and Nancy Agner.

Bill Meacham and Maxine Casper died in December 2019. Lane Pethel died unexpectedly in March of this year. All three had their funerals in the church. Lane’s service was at the beginning of the COVID-19 outbreak but no restrictions had been placed on gathering for worship. The other eight services have been graveside services with the exception of Doris Pethel’s funeral which was held at Powles-Staton Funeral Home and the graveside was at the National Cemetery behind the VA Medical Center.

With each of the graveside services at Christiana, we planned on having a memorial service for each of the deceased sometime in the “near” future when the pandemic was over. Well, here it is November 2020 and we are still under the pandemic and probably will be for another year. So here is what we are going to do: Sunday, November 1st is All Saints’ Day and we are going to have a Memorial Service for all those who have died since last year this time.

The worship service will be the funeral liturgy, in the midst of which we will celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Those of you who are family of those who died, be sure to invite all your family for this service. This will be the memorial service that would have been. A special invitation will be sent to an immediate family member inviting them and their whole family to this service.

The one thing we do not want to lose sight of during this pandemic is the fact that God loves and cares for us all. And he is especially mindful of those whom he claimed in the waters of Holy Baptism, who have died. Psalm 116:15 tells us: “*Precious in the sight of the LORD is the death of his saints.*”

Precious! When we die, our death is precious to God the Father. Why? Because it is the death of a life that was redeemed by the blood of his Son Jesus upon the cross. A death that ushered the soul of the saint through the gate of heaven into the presence of God.

The toughest part of a loved one in a nursing home dying of the COVID-19 virus is the family—and *their pastor*—not being able to be with them. It is hard to think of a loved one dying alone. But here is where the good news of the Christian faith comes in—saints of God are never alone! Jesus is with every saint who dies.

Jesus promises us in Matthew 28:20: “I am with you always, to the end of the age.” In Romans 8:35 the Apostle Paul asks the rhetorical question: “Who shall separate us from the love of Christ?” In verse 38 he tells us that “neither death, nor life ... will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.”

What a comfort that is to those who mourn the death of a loved one and were not able to be with them. This why a funeral or memorial service is so important for us Christians—it is a source of God’s love and comfort. I love how our service begins: “Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the source of all mercy and the God of all consolation. He comforts us in all our sorrows so that we can comfort others in their sorrows with the consolation we ourselves have received from God.”

What a blessing! God comforts us in our time of grief so that one day, we can comfort a brother or sister in Christ in their time of grief with the comfort we experienced from God. Our response is a resounding “**Thanks be to God.**”

So on November 1st make every effort to attend this special All Saints’ Service, to either be comforted at the death of a loved one, or to comfort those who mourn with the comfort you yourself have received from God. We will also remember those loved ones of members who died who were not members of Christiana. In the midst of it all we will receive our Lord’s body and blood for the forgiveness of our sins and the comfort of our souls as we commune with God and the people of God here and in heaven. Thanks be to God!

NALC Congregations to Vote on Amendments

Amendments to the NALC constitution were brought before the 2020 Convocation. They focused on making sure there were equal numbers of clergy and lay delegates at the convocation and changing the in person convocation from held every year to every two years. The reason being that smaller congregations were struggling to send a clergy and a lay delegate to convocation every year because of the cost. It usually is over \$3000 for both. In the years we don't meet in person there could be a virtual convocation like we had this year. Total cost is \$50—\$25 for Pastor Carl and \$25 for David Preslar for registration. The amendments were approved. Pastor Carl and David voted 'yes' to amend. Now it is your turn. Anytime constitutional changes are made two thirds of NALC congregations must ratify the convocation's vote in order for it to be adopted. So at our annual congregational meeting you will have the opportunity to vote. Copies of the amendments will be on display in the Narthex and the Elevator Lobby. A special ballot will be handed out to all voting members on November 8.

Thankfulness, studies show, has multiple physical, mental and emotional benefits. Psychologist Robert Emmons calls gratitude “fertilizer for the mind” because of its powerful effects.

He admits gratitude isn’t always easy — especially when life throws us curveballs (see the year 2020) — but says it can be most helpful during and after difficulties. Emmons suggests reframing challenges using thankfulness-based language. Ask, for example: Though I wasn’t grateful for the experience at the time, how can I be now? What lessons did I learn, and how did I grow as a person?

Throughout his letters, the apostle Paul reframes his extensive sufferings and urges us to do the same. “Give thanks in all circumstances,” he writes, “for this is God’s will for you in Christ Jesus” (1 Thessalonians 5:18, NIV).

Concerns, Receptions and Approvals:

Minutes from September 2020 meeting were approved.
Pastor's report for September 2020 was presented and approved.
Financial reports were presented and explained by Laurie Ritchie.
September income was \$3,018.68 below budget with YTD income \$1,789.78 above budget.
September spending was \$5,028.80 below budget with YTD spending \$38,385.01 less than budgeted.
Cash on hand \$90,541.0036.
September contributions to Brighten the Beacon were \$2,378.00

Committee and Auxiliary Reports and Concerns:

Social Ministry – Prepared the evening/breakfast meal at Rowan Helping Ministries on September 24th & September 25th. Thank you to LaVaughn Beaver, Angie Hayes, Jenny Roberts, Terry and Earlene Ritchie, Eddie and Debbie Eller and Richard and Linda Crouch for donating and /or preparing the meals.

Evangelism – Finalizing plans for Trunk-or-Treat Drive Thru event as well as the Thanksgiving Meal event. Seeking more volunteers.

LCW Miss Katherine Lyerly Circle – Collecting large cans of food for Rowan Helping Ministries.

Prayerful Consideration of Council Members:

NALC item to ratify at Annual Congregational Meeting – It is recommended that The NALC go from an annual Convocation to a Bi-annual Convocation with an online meeting being held on the off years. Christiana will vote on this item at our annual congregational meeting in November.

Council approved four confirmands to be confirmed: Kaylee Hawkins, TJ Coffey-Woods, Gabe Honeycutt and Ainslee Lowery.

Discussed the 2 A/C and Heating Units that supply the educational building. Medley Electric serviced these units and reported that both are working well now. A motion was made and passed that we construct a fence around the units for aesthetic purposes.

We have had some reoccurrence of the fire ants close to the bus area that have been successfully spot treated. If anyone sees additional fire ants, please contact Jason. He has some special spray for them.

Security Cameras are now installed and working properly in the elevator lobby area.

It was noted that the breezeway and elevator lobby are in need of some paint and pressure washing, including the gutters. A motion was made and passed to spend \$1,295.00 and \$650 (taken from Unbudgeted line item) to accomplish this task.

A motion was made and approved to work on a contract to be extended to groups using the new Fellowship Hall on a regular basis (i.e. the Tuesdays Veterans Meetings, etc.) This would prevent having to have a contract completed every week.

A motion was made and approved to have the 2 dead and dying trees in question on the property line of the church and the old Renegar property cut and removed. The motion included to spend up to \$3,000.00 from Unbudgeted line item to complete this task.

Noted that the LED lighting project is now complete in the sanctuary.

Noted that the fire extinguishers are all up to date and passed inspection.

Discussed the Pandemic reopening phase-in. Seeking ideas and suggestions from members on how to safely proceed and meet the needs of the congregation. Asking everyone to keep council aware of new/innovative ideas that are safe to offer.
