“Listen”

*Know this, my beloved brothers: let every person be quick to hear,
slow to speak, slow to anger...*

James 1:19(ESV)

We are a nation of talkers. We want to make our voice heard. We want to get our point across. And we care that we have our own voice, our own point to make. For proof I offer any political debate in recent years. The candidates are simply rude. They interrupt and talk over each other not considering once what the other person has to say.

Look at the editorials in the Salisbury Post on a divisive topic. Even when a definitive point is made, people will continue to argue their side, even though it makes no sense. That’s because people don’t listen. We don’t want to listen, we only want to make our point. And we don’t care what someone else has to say, unless they agree with us.

How did we get this way? How did we become such a rude people? I believe it is because we are not reading and absorbing God’s Word into our way of thinking. Look at the verse from James 1:19 printed above. James’ advice is for us to be quick to listen and slow to respond which will result in our being slow to get angry. It is very easy to get into an argument with someone and instead of listening to what they have to say, we are thinking about making our point to them. And if they do the same, it is very easy to see how such an argument can escalate into an angry shouting match.

Someone once pointed out that God gave us two ears and one mouth, as a sign that we are to listen twice as much as we speak. This is especially true when it comes to God. We need to spend more time listening to Him, than talking to Him. In Psalm 81:1 it says: *“Oh, that my people would listen to me.”*

How do we listen to God speak to us? Through His Word. Before we read Scripture, we need to pray: “O Lord, open my ears to hear you speak to me.” Then read, expecting God to answer our prayer. Psalm 46:10 reminds us to “Be still and know that I am God.” When we finish reading God’s Word, we should quietly meditate on what we have read, listening for God to speak to us. It is holy time in the presence of almighty God.

Too often, though, we are too busy to do that. We are in a hurry. We have things to do. So we read our brief Scripture passage and the devotional. Offer God a quick prayer, listing our requests (demands?) and then get on with the day. Is it no wonder, we have no idea what God wants us to do? How He wants us to live?

In the Devotion Book “Mornings with Jesus, 2021, Tuesday, April 20 Pamela Howard writes “Listening is an art and must be intentional.” To listen to someone, is to give them your undivided attention. In doing so, you show them that you care about what they have to say, what they think, what they care about. Only after we have truly heard the person speak and considered their point of view, should we then respond.

Look at Jesus, He cared for people while here on earth and took the time to listen to them and he responded to them in a way that led them to faith in God. When we respond to people, when we speak to them, is our main objective to get *our* point across, or to bring them closer to God?

Paul tells us in Philippians 2:3 to put the needs of others before our own. In essence what he is telling us is to follow Jesus’ example. Jesus put our need of having our sin paid for and forgiven, before his desire to remain in heaven. He *listened* to his Father, became one of us, showed us God’s love by dying on the cross and then rose victorious from the grave that we might have hope of eternal life.

There’s a saying that goes: *“People won’t care how much you know, until they know how much you care.”* If we want people to listen to us when we share our faith in Jesus with them, they need to feel that we truly care about them. Only then will they hear us.

So in the days ahead, let’s practice the art of listening to one another, that we might imitate our Lord Jesus and seek to lead people to Him. May we speak to voice the love of God, more than our voice.

CHRISTIANA PASTOR IS POUNDED MONDAY

Easter Monday evening was a joyous time to all the Sunday School scholars, teachers, and officers of Christiana Church, Rev. H. A. Trexler, pastor. An Easter egg hunt was held in the beautiful grove of the church in which more than two hundred participated. Other games and races were heartily engaged in by the school. At the close of the pleasant and enjoyable exercises, a bountiful table was spread and all took their fill and were satisfied.

Christiana congregation every Easter Monday for four years has been pounding the pastor bountifully. The first three years they met at the pastor's house, and last year at the church. All these poundings were great surprises, but this time they manipulated a plan of still greater surprise.

While the pastor and wife were enjoying the exercises and egg hunt at the church with the rest of the school, they managed, unknown to the pastor, to send a large truck load of every imaginable useful article for home use to the home of the pastor in Rockwell. Even among the articles boxed up was found a pig which made a big grunt as the pastor's wife opened the door of the house, almost frightening her.

It was the largest and most valuable pounding that the pastor ever received.
